Let us not forget that February was Back History Month along with Lincoln, Washington and Reagan birthday and the Republican Party was at first a movement, an ideal and ideal of Equal Rights - the cessation of the advancement of slavery and its ultimate abolition.

The first meeting of what would become the Republican Party was held in Wisconsin in 1854. Little more than a year later, the party controlled a majority in the U.S. House of Representatives. The next year saw a national Presidential nominating convention and its presidential candidate California's U.S. Senator John C. Fremont that announced to the nation that the Republican Party was a political force whose issues must be addressed, "Free Soil, Free Men, and Fremont."

The Republican Party has, since its inception, been the champion of individual rights, opportunity to achieve individual success, and a belief in free enterprise. The American political system is a wonder, and our free market economy has been a powerhouse envied by the entire world. The Republican Party has been at its core, dedicated to preserving and defending both those valuable assets.

Among the GOP's many accomplishments was the abolition of slavery, an achievement that is lost on many of today's critics. It took a protracted Civil War to make it happen and culminated with the assassination of the first Republican president by John Wilkes Booth (a Democrat) in

IS COMPROMISE IN THE WORKS?

Remember when President Reagan would send the Federal Budget to Congress and Speaker Tip O'Neal would say "it was dead on arrival?" And then the Democrats would come up with their own budget proposal and President Reagan and the Republicans and the Democrats would come together and compromise.

Reagan was acting in accord with the Budget and Accounting Act of 1921 which says that the President must submit a budget to Congress each year. In its current form, federal budget legislation specifies that the President submit a budget between the first Monday in January and the first Monday in February.

No federal budget has been passed by Congress since President Obama took office. One reason is because the Democrats, in control of Senate under the leadership of Senator Reid of Nevada, has not put it on the agenda for the Senate to debate and vote on the President's proposal. Each year the Republicans in the House have put together a budget and passed it, but their budget has died in Senate.

This year once again the Republicans in the House have proposed a federal budget and this year the Democrats in the Senate have proposed a different budget with rival priorities. But the nation is waiting on President Obama and his budget proposal. But, the President has asked for "more time" to come up with his spending plan for the third time in four years—once again missing the time-line required by the Budget Act of 1921.

How can there be any give and take, any compromise or "grand plan" if the President doesn't present his spending plan to the American people? But, to be fair, in the past, President Obama's budget proposals have not garnered one yes vote in Congress— not one single Democrat would vote for his budget plans—so I guess it's OK to be late.
